Discussion - Prairie Farms Project Specifically Concerning Stormwater

Roy Surdej expressed his concerns about the stormwater management issues in the Prairie Farms subdivision and the need for comprehensive planning to address the longstanding issue of water retention in the developed area. Mr. Surdej requested that the City not issue any additional building permits until the stormwater management issue is resolved.

Review and Provide Direction on the Next Step of the Kankakee Street Bridge Rehabilitation Project

Howard Hamilton, representing Environmental Design International, Inc. briefed the Committee on the Kankakee Street bridge project with the request for direction on the options related to the Historic Preservation Report. The Committee was in favor of contracting directly with TranSystems to complete the rehabilitation option of the Historic Preservation Report due to the rarity of this type of bridge in Illinois.

Review and Provide Direction to Proceed with FY25 MFT Project Scope as Planned

The Committee reviewed Director Gretencord's memo included in the agenda packet. Alderperson Mietzner expressed his concerns regarding the road condition on Sunset Drive, Lindy Lane, and Wilda Avenue and requested a plan to address those roads. The Committee was in favor of following the proposed outline related to FY25 Motor Fuel Tax Road Program.

Consideration to Approve the Request to Seek Utility Easement on Wilmington School District Property to Loop the Water Main from Laurel Avenue to Lexington Court

The Committee reviewed Director Gretencord's memo related to the proposed watermain loop. After a brief discussion, the Committee agreed to allow the Public Works Director to seek a utility easement on Wilmington School District property to loop the water main from Laurel Avenue to Lexington Court.

Consideration to Approve the Quote from Automatic Control Service to Upgrade the PLC and Install Cellular Communication to the South Arsenal Road Booster for \$12,635

The Committee reviewed and discussed the SCADA cellular upgrade and agreed that this purchase request be placed on the January 16, 2024, City Council consent agenda for full approval.

Consideration to Approved the Quote from Lindblad Construction Company to Construct and Install Track and Industrial Curtain Around the Lime Feed Equipment for \$13,025

The Committee reviewed and discussed the quote for an equipment upgrade at the Water Plant and agreed that this purchase request be placed on the January 16, 2024, City Council consent agenda for full approval.

Review and Provide Direction to the Repairs Needed to the West Lime Lagoon Casing and Catwalks

The Committee reviewed Director Gretencord's memo related to repair needs associated with Water Treatment Plant lime lagoons. Following a brief discussion, the Committee agreed that we request Chamlin & Associates create plans to replace the lime lagoon casing equipment and catwalks so we can put this project out for bid.

Review and Provide Direction to the Street Sweeping Program

The Committee reviewed the memo as presented in the agenda packet. The Committee directed Director Gretencord to prepare the necessary bid for contracted services for street sweeping and to not, at this time, surplus the City's current street sweeper.

During the month the patrol division had the following activity:

- 13 Pedestrian/Suspicious Stops were conducted
- 259 Business (Walk and Talk) Checks (officers entering businesses during normal hours)
- 10526 Premise Checks (officer checking cursory checks of businesses after hours)
- 3 misdemeanor and/or warrant arrests
- 0 felony arrests
- 88 written traffic citations

- 5 compliance/parking (local ordinance) tickets
- Officers handled an additional 569 calls for service and wrote 57 related reports.
- 8 trucks were weighed based on a suspicion of being overweight and fined accordingly

Investigations Division had the following activity:

- Added (6) new cases; continued background investigations for new hires

Illinois gives regional task force \$1.8 million to combat vehicle thefts

The <u>Tri-County Auto Theft Task Force</u> has received \$1.8 million in state funding to continue its efforts to combat vehicle thefts and other related crime in Will, Grundy, Kendall, Kankakee and Iroquois counties.

The funding is part of a larger initiative from Illinois Secretary of State Alexi Giannoulias' office to address vehicle thefts across the state, according to a report from Capital News Illinois. Other interagency law enforcement task forces similar to the Tri-County Auto Theft Task Force also have received funding.

Between July 2019 and June of this year, the Tri-County Auto Theft Task Force made more than 300 arrests and recovered more than 1,000 vehicles worth more than \$20 million, in addition to recovering more than \$800,000 in stolen cargo, said <u>Joliet police</u> Sgt. Ed Grizzle, who serves as director of the task force.

The task force has 12 officers from various police agencies, two prosecutors from two different counties and a civilian staff member, Grizzle said. The officers assigned are undercover detectives, he said.

"The task force is a covert unit that handles all matters regarding vehicle crimes – vehicular hijacking, stolen cars, title fraud, financial identity theft, cargo theft, catalytic converter theft to name a few," Grizzle said.

The task force also assists other police agencies in other crimes they are investigating to find a suspect vehicle, Grizzle said. It also teaches new police officers about vehicle-related crimes, he said.

The task force makes presentations to community groups, high schools, and colleges and universities, Grizzle said.

"The task force will continue to combat crimes in the areas of auto theft and continue to work with all police agencies – federal, state, county and local – to continue to make our communities safer," he said.

The task force has a 74% recovery rate of stolen vehicles and works closely with insurance companies and the National Insurance Crime Bureau, Grizzle said.

TRI-COUNTY AUTO THEFT UNIT

The Tri-County Auto Theft Task Force Unit was created by State legislature and imposes a fee for every auto insurance policy which is written on a car registered in the state. The funds are used to finance the efforts of a number of Illinois Task Forces organized to locate and prosecute auto theft cases.

The Tri-County Unit operates in Will, Grundy, and Kankakee Counties and is comprised of police officers from a number of police departments operating in the three-county area. The fund provides partial payment of the annual salary of an Assistant State's Attorney whose services are dedicated to the prosecution of auto theft-related cases.

The Task Force's goal is to find stolen vehicles and to root out organized auto theft rings. The efforts of the Task Force have prevented organized auto theft rings from being a significant problem in Will County and have stopped the proliferation of large scale chop shops.

By devoting one experienced felony prosecutor to handle daily court calls, process the vertical prosecution of the auto theft case from investigation to verdict, and develop cases for future prosecution, as well as the State's Attorney's Office executing search warrants and the use of judicially authorized eavesdrops, the State's Attorney's Office plays a meaningful role in the prevention of auto thefts in Will County and the Tri-County area.

Resolution No. 2024-01

RESOLUTION TO DISPOSE OF SURPLUS PROPERTY

WHEREAS, 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4 provides for the methodology to dispose of certain municipal property which is no longer necessary or useful to the city; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the surplus property may be transferred to another governmental agency or unit pursuant to Illinois statutes.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Chief of Police is hereby authorized to dispose of property identified in Exhibit A in a manner consistent with Illinois law as set forth above.

Re: Discussion Regarding Preliminary Plans for South Island Park Grant Project

Budget Impact: Grant Funded

History: Last summer, the City of Wilmington received notice of a grant award from the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity ("DCEO") in the amount of \$95,000 which is an appropriation from Representative DeLuca. The grant is a reappropriation of Build Illinois Bond Fund, the proceeds from which are to be used for capital improvements. The City of Wilmington is also in receipt of Rebuild Illinois ("RBI") funds equaling \$377,234.10. These funds need to be expended this year.

Staff Analysis: In September of 2023, Staff discussed potential uses for the grant with the City Council and advised that the funds which must be a bondable capital improvement provided that such expenditure purposes:

Are not recurring; are of a durable nature and not consumed in use; are not subject to inherent risk of failure, rapid technological obsolescence, or primarily intended to fulfill temporary requirements or needs; and appreciably increases, improves or enhances the interest of the State of Illinois, or its legally constituted subdivision, in the property, land, building or asset to be developed, constructed or improved.

Staff has identified two projects that would benefit from these funds; the first of which being the dam modification project and the second being the South Island Park project that was identified in the proposed island park development plan dated June, 2014 (see attached). As we will not be able to complete the dam modification project this year, our focus turned toward the realignment of the South Island entrance, parking lot structure, multi-use path and other amenities.

The estimated cost for completion of the plan drawn by Chamlin & Associates (see attached) is \$276,283.51. Using the \$95,000 from Representative DeLuca's appropriation will leave us with \$181,283.51 which may be drawn from the RBI fund balance.

Staff Request: Staff respectfully requests your consideration and feedback on the plans before you. We will need to formally submit the plans and the budget to the State for project approval and will be back before you for formal approval of invoices and bidding documents in the near future. At this time, we are requesting this item be placed on the agenda for preliminary plan approval and a motion to proceed with this project being funded with the DCEO and RBI funds.


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



- 8. ANY AND ALL DEWATERING REQUIRED TO KEEP EXCAVATIONS DRY SHALL BE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE CONTRACTOR.
- 9. CERTAIN INFORMATION SHOWN ON THESE DRAWINGS HAS BEEN OBTAINED FROM DRAWINGS OF RECORD. CONTRACTOR SHALL VERIFY SUCH INFORMATION PRIOR TO ACTUAL START OF WORK. WHERE DISCREPANCIES ARE DISCOVERED THE CONTRACTOR SHALL IMMEDIATELY NOTIFY THE OWNER'S REPRESENTATIVE. FAILURE BY THE CONTRACTOR TO IMMEDIATELY NOTIFY THE OWNER'S REPRESENTATIVE OF SUCH DISCREPANCIES SHALL RESULT IN THE CONTRACTOR BEARING THE FULL BURDEN OF ALL RISKS/COSTS ATTRIBUTED TO THE DISCOVERED DESCREPANCY.
- 10. PAY ITEMS IN THE SUMMARY OF QUANTITIES HAVE BEEN ESTIMATED. IF, IN THE ENGINEER'S OPINION, THE WORK IS NOT REQUIRED, THE ITEM WILL BE DEDUCTED FROM THE CONTRACT AND NO ADDITIONAL COMPENSATION WILL BE ALLOWED.
- 11. ONLY THOSE TREES DESIGNATED BY THE ENGINEER OR SHOWN ON THE PLANS SHALL BE REMOVED. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL PROTECT ALL REMAINING TREES FROM DAMAGE DUE TO HIS OPERATIONS. TREES DAMAGED DURING CONSTRUCTINO SHALL BE REPAIRED AT NO ADDITIONAL COST TO THE CITY.
- 12. ALL CITY STREETS SHALL BE KEPT FREE OF ALL DIRT, DUST AND DEBRIS AT ALL TIMES. AT THE END OF EACH WORKING DAY THE ADJACENT CITY STREETS WILL BE CLEARED VIA STREET SWEEPER WITH WATER, AS REQUESTED BY THE ENGINEER, AS NEEDED TO ENSURE ALL STREETS ARE KEPT FREE AND CLEAR OF ALL DIRT, DUST AND DEBRIS.

STORM SEWER CONSTRUCTION NOTES

AT THE CONCLUSION OF CONSTRUCTION OPERATIONS, ALL UTILITY STRUCTURES SHALL BE FREE FROM DIRT AND DEBRIS. THE WORK SPECIFIED ABOVE WILL NOT BE PAID FOR SEPARATELY BUT SHALL BE INCLUDED IN THE COST FOR THE STORM SEWER.
- 3. ANY EXISTING OR PROPOSED STORM SEWER DAMAGED BY THE CONTRACTOR DURING CONSTRUCTION SHALL BE REPLACED BY THE CONTRACTOR AT NO COST TO THE CITY.
- 4. DRAINAGE STRUCTURE OFFSETS AS SHOWN ON THE PLANS ARE GIVEN TO THE FOLLOWING POINTS: (A) FOR STRUCTURES FALLING IN THE CURB LINE TO THE EDGE OF PAVEMENT; B) FOR ALL OTHER STRUCTURES TO THE CENTER OF STRUCTURE.
- 5. TOP-OF-FRAME ELEVATIONS SHOWN ON THE PLANS FOR DRAINAGE STRUCTURES IN THE CURB LINE ARE EDGE-OF-PAVEMENT ELEVATIONS.
- 6. FRAME ELEVATIONS GIVEN ON THE PLANS ARE ONLY TO ASSIST THE CONTRACTOR IN DETERMINING THE APPROXIMATE OVERALL HEIGHT OF THE STRUCTURE. FRAMES OF ALL NEW, ADJUSTED OR RECONSTRUCTED STRUCTURES SHALL BE ADJUSTED TO THE FINAL ELEVATION OF THE AREA IN WHICH THEY ARE LOCATED AS PART OF THE STRUCTURE, ADJUSTMENT, OR RECONSTRUCTION COST.
- 7. WHEN EXISTING DRAINAGE OR SEWERAGE FACILITIES ARE DISTURBED, THE CONTRACTOR SHALL PROVIDE AND MAINTAIN TEMPORARY OUTLETS AND CONNECTIONS FOR ALL PUBLIC OR PRIVATE DRAINS, SEWERS, OR CATCH BASINS, HE SHALL PROVIDE FACILITIES TO TAKE ALL STORM WATER WHICH WOULD BE RECEIVED BY THESE FACILITIES AND DISCHARGE SAME. HE SHALL ALSO PROVIDE AND MAINTAIN AN EFFICIENT PUMPING PLANT, IF NECESSARY. AND A TEMPORARY OUTLET, AND BE PREPARED AT ALL TIMES TO DISPOSE OF THE WATER RECEIVED FROM THESE TEMPORARY CONNECTIONS UNTIL SUCH TIME THAT PERMANENT CONNECTIONS WITH SEWERS ARE CONSTRUCTED AND IN SERVICE. THIS WORK SHALL BE CONSIDERED INCIDENTAL TO THE CONTRACT.
- 8. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL NOT OPEN OR SHUT ANY WATER VALVES OR FIRE HYDRANTS WITHOUT PRIOR AUTHORIZATION FROM THE CITY. UNAUTHORIZED USE OF CITY WATER VALVES SHALL RESULT IN A FINE OF \$750 FOR EACH OCCURANCE.







PROPOSED TYPICAL SECTION STA 51+25 - STA 52+59.16


Budget Impact: Est. total match of \$110,000

History: The Will County Forest Preserve District and the City of Wilmington entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement ("IGA") which is a requirement for a grant application submitted for a kayak launch at North Island. Currently there are no launch sites in Wilmington and the North Island is a popular launch area for kayakers. You will note on the next page, organizations such as paddleillinoiswatertrails.org and www.illinoispaddle.com direct people to this area as a place of portage.

The Wilmington City Council approved the IGA and the grant application was submitted in Spring of 2023. Subsequently, Staff and the Wilmington Park District spent time with a representative of the Illinois Department of Natural Resources last summer identifying the proposed location of the launch and completing required forms substantiating the need and the appropriateness of the launch site.

On January 29, 2024 the City received notice that we received the grant. The City is now required to enter into an agreement ("Agreement") with the State of Illinois prior to receiving funds. Pursuant to the Agreement, the City would receive \$80,000 toward the project; the remainder of which would be split between the Forest Preserve District and the City. The current estimated project cost is \$300,000. Therefore, \$220,000 would be split equally.

Staff Analysis: Staff has reviewed the Agreement before you and respectfully requests your approval to move this item to the February 13, 2024 meeting for consideration.



"Grantee Portal" has the same meaning as in 44 III. Admin. Code 7000.30.

"Indirect Costs" has the same meaning as in 44 III. Admin. Code 7000.30.

"Indirect Cost Rate" means a device for determining in a reasonable manner the proportion of Indirect Costs each Program should bear. It is a ratio (expressed as a percentage) of the Indirect Costs to a Direct Cost base. If reimbursement of Indirect Costs is allowable under an Award, Grantor will not reimburse those Indirect Costs unless Grantee has established an Indirect Cost Rate covering the applicable activities and period of time, unless Indirect Costs are reimbursed at a fixed rate.

"Indirect Cost Rate Proposal" has the same meaning as in 44 III. Admin. Code 7000.30.

"Obligations" has the same meaning as in 44 III. Admin. Code 7000.30.

"Period of Performance" has the same meaning as in 44 III. Admin. Code 7000.30.

"Profit" means an entity's total revenue less its operating expenses, interest paid, depreciation, and taxes. "Profit" is synonymous with the term "net revenue."

"Program" means the services to be provided pursuant to this Agreement. "Program" is used interchangeably with "Project."

"Program Costs" means all Allowable Costs incurred by Grantee and the value of the contributions made by third parties in accomplishing the objectives of the Award during the Term of this Agreement.

"Related Parties" has the meaning set forth in Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 850-10-20.

"SAM" means the federal System for Award Management (SAM), the federal repository into which an entity must provide information required for the conduct of business as a recipient.

"State Grantee Compliance Enforcement System" means the statewide framework for State agencies to manage occurrences of non-compliance with Award requirements.

"State-issued Award" means the assistance that a grantee receives directly from a State agency. The funding source of the State-issued Award can be federal pass-through, State or a combination thereof. "State-issued Award" does not include the following:

- contracts issued pursuant to the Illinois Procurement Code that a State agency uses to buy goods or services from a contractor or a contract to operate State government-owned, contractor-operated facilities;

ARTICLE II AWARD INFORMATION

- 2.1. <u>Term.</u> This Agreement is effective <u>Upon execution by the Director</u> and expires on <u>03/31/2026</u> (the Term), unless terminated pursuant to this Agreement.
- 2.2. <u>Amount of Agreement</u>. Grant Funds **\$80,000.00**, of which **\$0.00** are federal funds. Grantee accepts Grantor's payment as specified in this ARTICLE.
- 2.3. <u>Payment</u>. Payment will be made as follows (*see* additional payment requirements in ARTICLE IV; additional payment provisions specific to this Award may be included in <u>PART TWO</u> or <u>PART THREE</u>):
- 2.4. <u>Award Identification Numbers</u>. If applicable, the Federal Award Identification Number (FAIN) is , the federal awarding agency is , and the Federal Award date is . only for the purpose(s) described herein. Grantee acknowledges that the Award is made solely upon this certification and that any false statements, misrepresentations, or material omissions will be the basis for immediate termination of this Agreement and repayment of all Grant Funds.

- 3.5. <u>Specific Certifications</u>. Grantee is responsible for compliance with the enumerated certifications in this Paragraph to the extent that the certifications apply to Grantee.

Admin. Code 750- Appendix A, which is incorporated herein; Public Works Employment Discrimination Act (775 ILCS 10/1 et seq.); Civil Rights Act of 1964 (as amended) (42 USC 2000a 2000h-6); Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 USC 794); Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (as amended) (42 USC 12101 et seq.); and the Age Discrimination Act of 1975 (42 USC 6101 et seq.).

(q) Internal Revenue Code and Illinois Income Tax Act. Grantee certifies that it complies with all provisions of the federal Internal Revenue Code (26 USC 1), the Illinois Income Tax Act (35 ILCS 5), and all regulations and rules promulgated thereunder, including withholding provisions and timely deposits of employee taxes and unemployment insurance taxes.

ARTICLE IV PAYMENT REQUIREMENTS

- 4.1. Availability of Appropriation; Sufficiency of Funds. This Agreement is contingent upon and subject to the availability of sufficient funds. Grantor may terminate or suspend this Agreement, in whole or in part, without penalty or further payment being required, if (i) sufficient funds for this Agreement have not been appropriated or otherwise made available to Grantor by the State or the federal funding source, (ii) the Governor or Grantor reserves funds, or (iii) the Governor or Grantor determines that funds will not or may not be available for payment. Grantor must provide notice, in writing, to Grantee of any such funding failure and its election to terminate or suspend this Agreement as soon as practicable. Any suspension or termination pursuant to this Paragraph will be effective upon the date of the written notice unless otherwise indicated.
- 4.2. <u>Pre-Award Costs.</u> Pre-award costs are not permitted unless specifically authorized by Grantor in **Exhibit A**, **PART TWO** or **PART THREE** of this Agreement. If they are authorized, pre-award costs must be charged to the initial Budget Period of the Award, unless otherwise specified by Grantor. 2 CFR 200.458.
- 4.3. <u>Return of Grant Funds</u>. Grantee must liquidate all Obligations incurred under the Award within forty-five (45) days of the end of the Period of Performance, or in the case of capital improvement Awards, within forty-five (45) days of the end of the time period the Grant Funds are available for expenditure or obligation, unless Grantor permits a longer period in <u>PART TWO</u> OR <u>PART THREE</u>.
- 4.4. <u>Cash Management Improvement Act of 1990</u>. Unless notified otherwise in <u>PART TWO</u> or <u>PART THREE</u>, Grantee must manage federal funds received under this Agreement in accordance with the Cash Management Improvement Act of 1990 (31 USC 6501 *et seq.*) and any other applicable federal laws or regulations. 2 CFR 200.305; 44 Ill. Admin. Code 7000.120.
- 4.5. <u>Payments to Third Parties</u>. Grantor will have no liability to Grantee when Grantor acts in good faith to redirect all or a portion of any Grantee payment to a third party. Grantor will be deemed to have acted in good faith when it is in possession of information that indicates Grantee authorized Grantor to intercept or redirect payments to a third party or when so ordered by a court of competent jurisdiction.
- 4.6. Modifications to Estimated Amount. If the Agreement amount is established on an estimated basis, then it may be increased by mutual agreement at any time during the Term. Grantor may decrease the estimated amount of this Agreement at any time during the Term if (i) Grantor believes Grantee will not use the funds during the Term, (ii) Grantor believes Grantee has used Grant Funds in a manner that was not authorized by this Agreement, (iii) sufficient funds for this Agreement have not been appropriated or otherwise made available to Grantor by the State or the federal funding source, (iv) the Governor or Grantor reserves funds, or (v) the Governor or Grantor determines that funds will or may not be available for payment. Grantee will be notified, in writing, of any adjustment of the estimated amount of this Agreement. In the event of such reduction, services provided by Grantee under Exhibit A may be reduced accordingly. Grantor must pay Grantee for work satisfactorily performed prior to the date of the notice regarding adjustment. 2 CFR 200.308.
 - 4.7. Interest.

- (a) All interest earned on Grant Funds held by a Grantee will be treated in accordance with 2 CFR 200.305(b)(9), unless otherwise provided in **PART TWO** or **PART THREE**. Grantee must remit annually any amount due in accordance with 2 CFR 200.305(b)(9) or to Grantor, as applicable.
- (b) Grant Funds must be placed in an insured account, whenever possible, that bears interest, unless exempted under 2 CFR 200.305(b)(8).
- 4.8. <u>Timely Billing Required</u>. Grantee must submit any payment request to Grantor within fifteen (15) days of the end of the quarter, unless another billing schedule is specified in <u>ARTICLE II, PART TWO</u>, or <u>PART THREE</u>. Failure to submit such payment request timely will render the amounts billed Unallowable Costs which Grantor cannot reimburse. In the event that Grantee is unable, for good cause, to submit its payment request timely, Grantee shall timely notify Grantor and may request an extension of time to submit the payment request. Grantor's approval of Grantee's request for an extension shall not be unreasonably withheld.
- 4.9. <u>Certification</u>. Pursuant to 2 CFR 200.415, each invoice and report submitted by Grantee (or subrecipient) must contain the following certification by an official authorized to legally bind Grantee (or subrecipient):

By signing this report [or payment request or both], I certify to the best of my knowledge and belief that the report [or payment request] is true, complete, and accurate; that the expenditures, disbursements and cash receipts are for the purposes and objectives set forth in the terms and conditions of the State or federal pass-through award; and that supporting documentation has been submitted as required by the grant agreement. I acknowledge that approval for any other expenditure described herein is considered conditional subject to further review and verification in accordance with the monitoring and records retention provisions of the grant agreement. I am aware that any false, fictitious, or fraudulent information, or the omission of any material fact, may subject me to criminal, civil or administrative penalties for fraud, false statements, false claims or otherwise (U.S. Code Title 18, Section 1001 and Title 31, Sections 3729-3730 and 3801-3812; 30 ILCS 708/120).

ARTICLE V SCOPE OF AWARD ACTIVITIES/PURPOSE OF AWARD

- 5.1. Scope of Award Activities/Purpose of Award. Grantee must perform as described in this Agreement, including as described in Exhibit A (Project Description), Exhibit B (Deliverables or Milestones), and Exhibit D (Performance Measures and Standards), as applicable. Grantee must further comply with all terms and conditions set forth in the Notice of State Award (44 III. Admin. Code 7000.360) which is incorporated herein by reference. All Grantor-specific provisions and programmatic reporting required under this Agreement are described in PART TWO (Grantor-Specific Terms). All Project-specific provisions and reporting required under this Agreement are described in PART THREE (Project-Specific Terms).
- 5.2. <u>Scope Revisions</u>. Grantee must obtain Prior Approval from Grantor whenever a scope revision is necessary for one or more of the reasons enumerated in 44 III. Admin. Code 7000.370(b)(2). All requests for scope revisions that require Grantor approval must be signed by Grantee's authorized representative and submitted to Grantor for approval. Expenditure of funds under a requested revision is prohibited and will not be reimbursed if expended before Grantor gives written approval. 2 CFR 200.308.

5.3. <u>Specific Conditions</u>. If applicable, specific conditions required after a risk assessment are included in **Exhibit E**. Grantee must adhere to the specific conditions listed therein. 44 III. Admin. Code 7000.340(e).

ARTICLE VI BUDGET

- 6.1. <u>Budget</u>. The Budget submitted by Grantee at application, or a revised Budget subsequently submitted and approved by Grantor, is considered final and is incorporated herein by reference.
- 6.2. <u>Budget Revisions</u>. Grantee must obtain Prior Approval, whether mandated or discretionary, from Grantor whenever a Budget revision, is necessary for one or more of the reasons enumerated in 44 III. Admin. Code 7000.370(b). All requests for Budget revisions that require Grantor approval must be signed by Grantee's authorized representative and submitted to Grantor for approval. Expenditure of funds under a requested revision is prohibited and will not be reimbursed if expended before Grantor gives written approval.
- 6.3. <u>Notification</u>. Within thirty (30) calendar days from the date of receipt of the request for Budget revisions, Grantor will review the request and notify Grantee whether the Budget revision has been approved, denied, or the date upon which a decision will be reached. 44 Ill. Admin. Code 7000.370(b)(7).

ARTICLE VII ALLOWABLE COSTS

7.1. <u>Allowability of Costs; Cost Allocation Methods</u>. The allowability of costs and cost allocation methods for work performed under this Agreement will be determined in accordance with 2 CFR Part 200 Subpart E and Appendices III, IV, V, and VII.

7.2. Indirect Cost Rate Submission.

- (a) All grantees, except for Local Education Agencies (as defined in 34 CFR 77.1), must make an Indirect Cost Rate election in the Grantee Portal, even grantees that do not charge or expect to charge Indirect Costs. 44 Ill. Admin. Code 7000.420(e).
 - (i) Waived and de minimis Indirect Cost Rate elections will remain in effect until Grantee elects a different option.
- (b) Grantee must submit an Indirect Cost Rate Proposal in accordance with federal and State regulations, in a format prescribed by Grantor. For grantees who have never negotiated an Indirect Cost Rate before, the Indirect Cost Rate Proposal must be submitted for approval no later than three months after the effective date of the Award. For grantees who have previously negotiated an Indirect Cost Rate, the Indirect Cost Rate Proposal must be submitted for approval within 180 days of Grantee's fiscal year end, as dictated in the applicable appendices, such as:
 - (i) Appendix VII to 2 CFR Part 200 governs Indirect Cost Rate Proposals for state and Local Governments and Indian Tribes,
 - (ii) Appendix III to 2 CFR Part 200 governs Indirect Cost Rate Proposals for public and private institutions of higher education,
 - (iii) Appendix IV to 2 CFR Part 200 governs Indirect (F&A) Costs Identification and Assignment, and Rate Determination for Nonprofit Organizations, and

- (iv) Appendix V to 2 CFR Part 200 governs state/Local Governmentwide Central Service Cost Allocation Plans.
- (c) A grantee who has a current, applicable rate negotiated by a cognizant federal agency must provide to Grantor a copy of its Indirect Cost Rate acceptance letter from the federal government and a copy of all documentation regarding the allocation methodology for costs used to negotiate that rate, e.g., without limitation, the cost policy statement or disclosure narrative statement. Grantor will accept that Indirect Cost Rate, up to any statutory, rule-based or programmatic limit.
- (d) A grantee who does not have a current negotiated rate, may elect to charge a de minimis rate of 10% of Modified Total Direct Cost which may be used indefinitely. No documentation is required to justify the 10% de minimis Indirect Cost Rate. 2 CFR 200.414(f).
- 7.3. <u>Transfer of Costs</u>. Cost transfers between Grants, whether as a means to compensate for cost overruns or for other reasons, are unallowable. 2 CFR 200.451.
- 7.4. <u>Commercial Organization Cost Principles</u>. The federal cost principles and procedures for cost analysis and the determination, negotiation and allowance of costs that apply to commercial organizations are set forth in 48 CFR Part 31.
- 7.5. <u>Financial Management Standards</u>. The financial management systems of Grantee must meet the following standards:
 - (a) Accounting System. Grantee organizations must have an accounting system that provides accurate, current, and complete disclosure of all financial transactions related to each state- and federally-funded Program. Accounting records must contain information pertaining to State and federal pass-through awards, authorizations, Obligations, unobligated balances, assets, outlays, and income. These records must be maintained on a current basis and balanced at least quarterly. Cash contributions to the Program from third parties must be accounted for in the general ledger with other Grant Funds. Third party in-kind (non-cash) contributions are not required to be recorded in the general ledger, but must be under accounting control, possibly through the use of a memorandum ledger. To comply with 2 CFR 200.305(b)(7)(i) and 30 ILCS 708/97, Grantee must use reasonable efforts to ensure that funding streams are delineated within Grantee's accounting system. 2 CFR 200.302.
 - (b) **Source Documentation**. Accounting records must be supported by such source documentation as canceled checks, bank statements, invoices, paid bills, donor letters, time and attendance records, activity reports, travel reports, contractual and consultant agreements, and subaward documentation. All supporting documentation must be clearly identified with the Award and general ledger accounts which are to be charged or credited.
 - (i) The documentation standards for salary charges to Grants are prescribed by 2 CFR 200.430, and in the cost principles applicable to the Grantee's organization.
 - (ii) If records do not meet the standards in 2 CFR 200.430, then Grantor may notify Grantee in <u>PART TWO</u>, <u>PART THREE</u> or <u>Exhibit E</u> of the requirement to submit personnel activity reports. 2 CFR 200.430(i)(8). Personnel activity reports must account on an after-the-fact basis for one hundred percent (100%) of the employee's actual time, separately indicating the time spent on the Award, other grants or projects, vacation or sick leave, and administrative time, if applicable. The reports must be signed by the employee, approved by the appropriate official, and coincide with a pay period. These time records must be used to record the distribution of salary costs to the appropriate accounts no less frequently than quarterly.

- (iii) Formal agreements with independent contractors, such as consultants, must include a description of the services to be performed, the period of performance, the fee and method of payment, an itemization of travel and other costs which are chargeable to the agreement, and the signatures of both the contractor and an appropriate official of Grantee.
- (iv) If third party in-kind (non-cash) contributions are used for Award purposes, the valuation of these contributions must be supported with adequate documentation.
- (c) **Internal Control**. Grantee must maintain effective control and accountability for all cash, real and personal property, and other assets. Grantee must adequately safeguard all such property and must provide assurance that it is used solely for authorized purposes. Grantee must also have systems in place that provide reasonable assurance that the information is accurate, allowable, and compliant with the terms and conditions of this Agreement. 2 CFR 200.303.
- (d) **Budget Control**. Grantee must maintain records of expenditures for each Award by the cost categories of the approved Budget (including Indirect Costs that are charged to the Award), and actual expenditures are to be compared with budgeted amounts at least quarterly.
- (e) **Cash Management**. Requests for advance payment must be limited to Grantee's immediate cash needs. Grantee must have written procedures to minimize the time elapsing between the receipt and the disbursement of Grant Funds to avoid having excess funds on hand. 2 CFR 200.305.
- 7.6. <u>Profits</u>. It is not permitted for any person or entity to earn a Profit from an Award. *See, e.g.,* 2 CFR 200.400(g); *see also* 30 ILCS 708/60(a)(7).
- 7.7. <u>Management of Program Income</u>. Grantee is encouraged to earn income to defray Program Costs where appropriate, subject to 2 CFR 200.307.

ARTICLE VIII LOBBYING

- 8.1. Improper Influence. Grantee certifies that it will not use and has not used Grant Funds to influence or attempt to influence an officer or employee of any government agency or a member or employee of the State or federal legislature in connection with the awarding of any agreement, the making of any grant, the making of any loan, the entering into of any cooperative agreement, or the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment or modification of any agreement, grant, loan or cooperative agreement. Additionally, Grantee certifies that it has filed the required certification under the Byrd Anti-Lobbying Amendment (31 USC 1352), if applicable.
- 8.2. <u>Federal Form LLL</u>. If any federal funds, other than federally-appropriated funds, were paid or will be paid to any person for influencing or attempting to influence any of the above persons in connection with this Agreement, the undersigned must also complete and submit Federal Form LLL, Disclosure of Lobbying Activities Form, in accordance with its instructions.
- 8.3. <u>Lobbying Costs</u>. Grantee certifies that it is in compliance with the restrictions on lobbying set forth in 2 CFR 200.450. For any Indirect Costs associated with this Agreement, total lobbying costs must be separately identified in the Program Budget, and thereafter treated as other Unallowable Costs.
- 8.4. <u>Procurement Lobbying</u>. Grantee warrants and certifies that it and, to the best of its knowledge, its subrecipients have complied and will comply with Illinois Executive Order No. 1 (2007) (EO 1-2007). EO 1-2007

generally prohibits grantees and subcontractors from hiring the then-serving Governor's family members to lobby procurement activities of the State, or any other unit of government in Illinois including local governments, if that procurement may result in a contract valued at over \$25,000. This prohibition also applies to hiring for that same purpose any former State employee who had procurement authority at any time during the one-year period preceding the procurement lobbying activity.

- 8.5. <u>Subawards</u>. Grantee must include the language of this ARTICLE in the award documents for any subawards made pursuant to this Award at all tiers. All subrecipients are also subject to certification and disclosure. Pursuant to Appendix II(I) to 2 CFR Part 200, Grantee must forward all disclosures by contractors regarding this certification to Grantor.
- 8.6. <u>Certification</u>. This certification is a material representation of fact upon which reliance was placed to enter into this transaction and is a prerequisite for this transaction, pursuant to 31 USC 1352. Any person who fails to file the required certifications will be subject to a civil penalty of not less than \$10,000, and not more than \$100,000, for each such failure.

ARTICLE IX MAINTENANCE AND ACCESSIBILITY OF RECORDS; MONITORING

- 9.1. Records Retention. Grantee must maintain for three (3) years from the date of submission of the final expenditure report, adequate books, all financial records and, supporting documents, statistical records, and all other records pertinent to this Award, adequate to comply with 2 CFR 200.334, unless a different retention period is specified in 2 CFR 200.334, 44 Ill. Admin. Code 7000.430(a) and (b) or **PART TWO** or **PART THREE**. If any litigation, claim or audit is started before the expiration of the retention period, the records must be retained until all litigation, claims or audit exceptions involving the records have been resolved and final action taken.
- 9.2. Accessibility of Records. Grantee, in compliance with 2 CFR 200.337 and 44 III. Admin. Code 7000.430(f), must make books, records, related papers, supporting documentation and personnel relevant to this Agreement available to authorized Grantor representatives, the Illinois Auditor General, Illinois Attorney General, any Executive Inspector General, Grantor's Inspector General, federal authorities, any person identified in 2 CFR 200.337, and any other person as may be authorized by Grantor (including auditors), by the State of Illinois or by federal statute. Grantee must cooperate fully in any such audit or inquiry.
- 9.3. <u>Failure to Maintain Books and Records</u>. Failure to maintain books, records and supporting documentation, as described in this ARTICLE, establishes a presumption in favor of the State for the recovery of any Grant Funds paid by the State under this Agreement for which adequate books, records and supporting documentation are not available to support disbursement.
- 9.4. <u>Monitoring and Access to Information</u>. Grantee must monitor its activities to assure compliance with applicable state and federal requirements and to assure its performance expectations are being achieved. Grantor will monitor the activities of Grantee to assure compliance with all requirements and performance expectations of the Award. Grantee must timely submit all financial and performance reports, and must supply, upon Grantor's request, documents and information relevant to the Award. Grantor may make site visits as warranted by Program needs. 2 CFR 200.329; 200.332. Additional monitoring requirements may be in <u>PART TWO</u> or <u>PART THREE</u>.

ARTICLE X FINANCIAL REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

10.1. Required Periodic Financial Reports. Grantee must submit financial reports as requested and in the format required by Grantor no later than the dues date(s) specified in PART TWO or PART THREE. Grantee must submit quarterly reports with Grantor describing the expenditure(s) of the funds related thereto, unless more frequent reporting is required by the Grantee due to the funding source or pursuant to specific award conditions. 2 CFR 200.208. Any report required by 30 ILCS 708/125 may be detailed in PART TWO or PART THREE.

10.2. Financial Close-out Report.

- (a) Grantee must submit a financial Close-out Report, in the format required by Grantor, by the due date specified in <u>PART TWO</u> or <u>PART THREE</u>, which must be no later than sixty (60) calendar days following the end of the Period of Performance for this Agreement or Agreement termination. The format of this financial Close-out Report must follow a format prescribed by Grantor. 2 CFR 200.344; 44 III. Admin. Code 7000.440(b).
- (b) If an audit or review of Grantee occurs and results in adjustments after Grantee submits a Close-out Report, Grantee must submit a new financial Close-out Report based on audit adjustments, and immediately submit a refund to Grantor, if applicable. 2 CFR 200.345; 44 Ill. Admin. Code 7000.450.
- 10.3. Effect of Failure to Comply. Failure to comply with the reporting requirements in this Agreement may cause a delay or suspension of funding or require the return of improper payments or Unallowable Costs, and will be considered a material breach of this Agreement. Grantee's failure to comply with ARTICLE X, ARTICLE XI, or ARTICLE XVII will be considered prima facie evidence of a breach and may be admitted as such, without further proof, into evidence in an administrative proceeding before Grantor, or in any other legal proceeding. Grantee should refer to the State Grantee Compliance Enforcement System for policy and consequences for failure to comply. 44 Ill. Admin. Code 7000.80.

ARTICLE XI PERFORMANCE REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

- 11.1. Required Periodic Performance Reports. Grantee must submit performance reports as requested and in the format required by Grantor no later than the due date(s) specified in PART TWO or PART THREE. 44 III. Admin. Code 7000.410. Grantee must report to Grantor on the performance measures listed in Exhibit D, PART TWO or PART THREE at the intervals specified by Grantor, which must be no less frequent than annually and no more frequent than quarterly, unless otherwise specified in PART TWO, PART THREE, or Exhibit E pursuant to specific award conditions. For certain construction-related Awards, such reports may be exempted as identified in PART TWO or PART THREE. 2 CFR 200.329.
- 11.2. <u>Performance Close-out Report</u>. Grantee must submit a performance Close-out Report, in the format required by Grantor by the due date specified in <u>PART TWO</u> or <u>PART THREE</u>, which must be no later than 60 calendar days following the end of the Period of Performance or Agreement termination. 2 CFR 200.344; 44 Ill. Admin. Code 7000.440(b).
- 11.3. <u>Content of Performance Reports</u>. Pursuant to 2 CFR 200.329(b) and (c), all performance reports must relate the financial data and accomplishments to the performance goals and objectives of this Award and also include the following: a comparison of actual accomplishments to the objectives of the Award established for the period; where the accomplishments can be quantified, a computation of the cost and demonstration of cost effective practices (e.g., through unit cost data); performance trend data and analysis if required; and reasons

why established goals were not met, if appropriate. Additional content and format guidelines for the performance reports will be determined by Grantor contingent on the Award's statutory, regulatory and administrative requirements, and are included in **PART TWO** or **PART THREE** of this Agreement.

ARTICLE XII AUDIT REQUIREMENTS

- 12.1. <u>Audits</u>. Grantee is subject to the audit requirements contained in the Single Audit Act Amendments of 1996 (31 USC 7501-7507), Subpart F of 2 CFR Part 200, and the audit rules and policies set forth by the Governor's Office of Management and Budget. 30 ILCS 708/65(c); 44 Ill. Admin. Code 7000.90.
- 12.2. <u>Consolidated Year-End Financial Reports (CYEFR)</u>. All grantees must complete and submit a CYEFR through the Grantee Portal, except those exempted by federal or State statute or regulation, as set forth in <u>PART TWO</u> or <u>PART THREE</u>. The CYEFR is a required schedule in Grantee's audit report if Grantee is required to complete and submit an audit report as set forth herein.
 - (a) Grantee's CYEFR must cover the same period as the audited financial statements, if required, and must be submitted in accordance with the audit schedule at 44 III. Admin. Code 7000.90. If Grantee is not required to complete audited financial statements, the CYEFR must cover Grantee's fiscal year and must be submitted within 6 months of the Grantee's fiscal year-end.
 - (b) The CYEFR must include an in relation to opinion from the auditor of the financial statements included in the audit.
 - (c) The CYEFR must follow a format prescribed by Grantor.
 - 12.3. Entities That Are Not "For-Profit".
 - (a) This Paragraph applies to Grantees that are not "for-profit" entities.
 - (b) Single and Program-Specific Audits. If, during its fiscal year, Grantee expends \$750,000 or more in federal Awards (direct federal and federal pass-through awards combined), Grantee must have a single audit or program-specific audit conducted for that year as required by 2 CFR 200.501 and other applicable sections of Subpart F of 2 CFR Part 200. The audit report packet must be completed as described in 2 CFR 200.512 (single audit) or 2 CFR 200.507 (program-specific audit), 44 III. Admin. Code 7000.90(h)(1) and the current GATA audit manual and submitted to the Federal Audit Clearinghouse, as required by 2 CFR 200.512. The results of peer and external quality control reviews, management letters issued by the auditors and their respective corrective action plans if significant deficiencies or material weaknesses are identified, and the CYEFR(s) must be submitted to the Grantee Portal. The due date of all required submissions set forth in this Paragraph is the earlier of (i) thirty (30) calendar days after receipt of the auditor's report(s) or (ii) nine (9) months after the end of Grantee's audit period.
 - (c) <u>Financial Statement Audit</u>. If, during its fiscal year, Grantee expends less than \$750,000 in federal Awards, Grantee is subject to the following audit requirements:
 - (i) If, during its fiscal year, Grantee expends \$500,000 or more in State-issued Awards, Grantee must have a financial statement audit conducted in accordance with the Generally Accepted Government Auditing Standards (GAGAS). Grantee may be subject to additional requirements in **PART TWO**, **PART THREE** or **Exhibit E** based on Grantee's risk profile.

- (ii) If, during its fiscal year, Grantee expends less than \$500,000 in State-issued Awards, but expends \$300,000 or more in State-issued Awards, Grantee must have a financial statement audit conducted in accordance with the Generally Accepted Auditing Standards (GAAS).
- (iii) If Grantee is a Local Education Agency (as defined in 34 CFR 77.1), Grantee must have a financial statement audit conducted in accordance with GAGAS, as required by 23 III. Admin. Code 100.110, regardless of the dollar amount of expenditures of State-issued Awards.
- (iv) If Grantee does not meet the requirements in subsections 12.3(b) and 12.3(c)(i-iii) but is required to have a financial statement audit conducted based on other regulatory requirements, Grantee must submit those audits for review.
- (v) Grantee must submit its financial statement audit report packet, as set forth in 44 III. Admin. Code 7000.90(h)(2) and the current GATA audit manual, to the Grantee Portal within the earlier of (i) thirty (30) calendar days after receipt of the auditor's report(s) or (ii) six (6) months after the end of Grantee's audit period.

12.4. "For-Profit" Entities.

- (a) This Paragraph applies to Grantees that are "for-profit" entities.
- (b) Program-Specific Audit. If, during its fiscal year, Grantee expends \$750,000 or more in federal pass-through funds from State-issued Awards, Grantee must have a program-specific audit conducted in accordance with 2 CFR 200.507. The auditor must audit federal pass-through programs with federal pass-through Awards expended that, in the aggregate, cover at least 50 percent (0.50) of total federal pass-through Awards expended. The audit report packet must be completed as described in 2 CFR 200.507 (program-specific audit), 44 III. Admin. Code 7000.90 and the current GATA audit manual, and must be submitted to the Grantee Portal. The due date of all required submissions set forth in this Paragraph is the earlier of (i) thirty (30) calendar days after receipt of the auditor's report(s) or (ii) nine (9) months after the end of Grantee's audit period.
- (c) <u>Financial Statement Audit</u>. If, during its fiscal year, Grantee expends less than \$750,000 in federal pass-through funds from State-issued Awards, Grantee must follow all of the audit requirements in Paragraphs 12.3(c)(i)-(v), above.
- (d) <u>Publicly-Traded Entities</u>. If Grantee is a publicly-traded company, Grantee is not subject to the single audit or program-specific audit requirements, but must submit its annual audit conducted in accordance with its regulatory requirements.
- 12.5. Performance of Audits. For those organizations required to submit an independent audit report, the audit must be conducted by the Illinois Auditor General (as required for certain governmental entities only), or a Certified Public Accountant or Certified Public Accounting Firm licensed in the State of Illinois or in accordance with Section 5.2 of the Illinois Public Accounting Act (225 ILCS 450/5.2). For all audits required to be performed subject to GAGAS or Generally Accepted Auditing Standards, Grantee must request and maintain on file a copy of the auditor's most recent peer review report and acceptance letter. Grantee must follow procedures prescribed by Grantor for the preparation and submission of audit reports and any related documents.
- 12.6. <u>Delinquent Reports</u>. When audit reports or financial statements required under this ARTICLE are prepared by the Illinois Auditor General, if they are not available by the above-specified due date, they must be provided to Grantor within thirty (30) days of becoming available. Grantee should refer to the State Grantee Compliance Enforcement System for the policy and consequences for late reporting. 44 Ill. Admin. Code 7000.80.

ARTICLE XIII TERMINATION; SUSPENSION; NON-COMPLIANCE

13.1. Termination.

- (a) Either Party may terminate this Agreement, in whole or in part, upon thirty (30) calendar days' prior written notice to the other Party.
- (b) If terminated by the Grantee, Grantee must include the reasons for such termination, the effective date, and, in the case of a partial termination, the portion to be terminated. If Grantor determines in the case of a partial termination that the reduced or modified portion of the Award will not accomplish the purposes for which the Award was made, Grantor may terminate the Agreement in its entirety. 2 CFR 200.340(a)(4).
 - (c) This Agreement may be terminated, in whole or in part, by Grantor:
 - (i) Pursuant to a funding failure under Paragraph 4.1;
 - (ii) If Grantee fails to comply with the terms and conditions of this or any Award, application or proposal, including any applicable rules or regulations, or has made a false representation in connection with the receipt of this or any Award; or
 - (iii) If the Award no longer effectuates the Program goals or agency priorities as set forth in **Exhibit A**, **PART TWO** or **PART THREE**.
- 13.2. <u>Suspension</u>. Grantor may suspend this Agreement, in whole or in part, pursuant to a funding failure under Paragraph 4.1 or if the Grantee fails to comply with terms and conditions of this or any Award. If suspension is due to Grantee's failure to comply, Grantor may withhold further payment and prohibit Grantee from incurring additional Obligations pending corrective action by Grantee or a decision to terminate this Agreement by Grantor. Grantor may allow necessary and proper costs that Grantee could not reasonably avoid during the period of suspension.
- 13.3. <u>Non-compliance</u>. If Grantee fails to comply with the U.S. Constitution, applicable statutes, regulations or the terms and conditions of this or any Award, Grantor may impose additional conditions on Grantee, as described in 2 CFR 200.208. If Grantor determines that non-compliance cannot be remedied by imposing additional conditions, Grantor may take one or more of the actions described in 2 CFR 200.339. The Parties must follow all Grantor policies and procedures regarding non-compliance, including, but not limited to, the procedures set forth in the State Grantee Compliance Enforcement System. 44 III. Admin. Code 7000.80 and 7000.260.
- 13.4. <u>Objection</u>. If Grantor suspends or terminates this Agreement, in whole or in part, for cause, or takes any other action in response to Grantee's non-compliance, Grantee may avail itself of any opportunities to object and challenge such suspension, termination or other action by Grantor in accordance with any applicable processes and procedures, including, but not limited to, the procedures set forth in the State Grantee Compliance Enforcement System. 2 CFR 200.342; 44 Ill. Admin. Code 7000.80 and 7000.260.
 - 13.5. Effects of Suspension and Termination.

- (a) Grantor may credit Grantee for allowable expenditures incurred in the performance of authorized services under this Agreement prior to the effective date of a suspension or termination.
- (b) Except as set forth in subparagraph (c), below, Grantee must not incur any costs or Obligations that require the use of Grant Funds after the effective date of a suspension or termination, and must cancel as many outstanding Obligations as possible.
- (c) Costs to Grantee resulting from Obligations incurred by Grantee during a suspension or after termination of the Agreement are not allowable unless Grantor expressly authorizes them in the notice of suspension or termination or subsequently. However, Grantor may allow costs during a suspension or after termination if:
 - (i) The costs result from Obligations properly incurred before the effective date of suspension or termination, are not in anticipation of the suspension or termination, and the costs would be allowable if the Agreement was not suspended or terminated prematurely. 2 CFR 200.343.
- 13.6. <u>Close-out of Terminated Agreements</u>. If this Agreement is terminated, in whole or in part, the Parties must comply with all close-out and post-termination requirements of this Agreement. 2 CFR 200.340(d).

ARTICLE XIV SUBCONTRACTS/SUBAWARDS

- 14.1. <u>Subcontracting/Subrecipients/Delegation</u>. Grantee must not subcontract nor issue a subaward for any portion of this Agreement nor delegate any duties hereunder without Prior Approval of Grantor. The requirement for Prior Approval is satisfied if the subcontractor or subrecipient has been identified in the uniform grant application, such as, without limitation, a Project description, and Grantor has approved. Grantee must notify any potential subrecipient that the subrecipient must obtain and provide to the Grantee a Unique Entity Identifier prior to receiving a subaward. 2 CFR 25.300.
- 14.2. <u>Application of Terms</u>. If Grantee enters into a subaward agreement with a subrecipient, Grantee must notify the subrecipient of the applicable laws and regulations and terms and conditions of this Award by attaching this Agreement to the subaward agreement. The terms of this Agreement apply to all subawards authorized in accordance with Paragraph 14.1. 2 CFR 200.101(b)(2).
- 14.3. <u>Liability as Guaranty</u>. Grantee will be liable as guarantor for any Grant Funds it obligates to a subrecipient or subcontractor pursuant to this ARTICLE in the event Grantor determines the funds were either misspent or are being improperly held and the subrecipient or subcontractor is insolvent or otherwise fails to return the funds. 2 CFR 200.345; 30 ILCS 705/6; 44 Ill. Admin. Code 7000.450(a).

ARTICLE XV NOTICE OF CHANGE

15.1. <u>Notice of Change</u>. Grantee must notify Grantor if there is a change in Grantee's legal status, FEIN, UEI, SAM registration status, Related Parties, senior management (for non-governmental grantees only) or address. If the change is anticipated, Grantee must give thirty (30) days' prior written notice to Grantor. If the change is unanticipated, Grantee must give notice as soon as practicable thereafter. Grantor reserves the right to take any and all appropriate action as a result of such change(s).

- 15.2. <u>Failure to Provide Notification</u>. To the extent permitted by Illinois law (*see* Paragraph 21.2), Grantee must hold harmless Grantor for any acts or omissions of Grantor resulting from Grantee's failure to notify Grantor as required by Paragraph 15.1.
- 15.3. <u>Notice of Impact</u>. Grantee must notify Grantor in writing of any event, including, by not limited to, becoming a party to litigation, an investigation, or transaction that may have a material impact on Grantee's ability to perform under this Agreement. Grantee must provide notice to Grantor as soon as possible, but no later than five (5) days after Grantee becomes aware that the event may have a material impact.
- 15.4. <u>Effect of Failure to Provide Notice</u>. Failure to provide the notice described in this ARTICLE is grounds for termination of this Agreement and any costs incurred after the date notice should have been given may be disallowed.

ARTICLE XVI STRUCTURAL REORGANIZATION AND RECONSTITUTION OF BOARD MEMBERSHIP

16.1. Effect of Reorganization. This Agreement is made by and between Grantor and Grantee, as Grantee is currently organized and constituted. Grantor does not agree to continue this Agreement, or any license related thereto, should Grantee significantly reorganize or otherwise substantially change the character of its corporate structure, business structure or governance structure. Grantee must give Grantor prior notice of any such action or changes significantly affecting its overall structure or, for non-governmental grantees only, management makeup (for example, a merger or a corporate restructuring), and must provide all reasonable documentation necessary for Grantor to review the proposed transaction including financial records and corporate and shareholder minutes of any corporation which may be involved. Grantor reserves the right to terminate the Agreement based on whether the newly organized entity is able to carry out the requirements of the Award. This ARTICLE does not require Grantee to report on minor changes in the makeup of its board membership or governance structure, as applicable. Nevertheless, PART TWO or PART THREE may impose further restrictions. Failure to comply with this ARTICLE constitutes a material breach of this Agreement.

ARTICLE XVII CONFLICT OF INTEREST

- 17.1. <u>Required Disclosures</u>. Grantee must immediately disclose in writing any potential or actual Conflict of Interest to Grantor. 2 CFR 200.113; 30 ILCS 708/35.
- 17.2. Prohibited Payments. Payments made by Grantor under this Agreement must not be used by Grantee to compensate, directly or indirectly, any person currently holding an elective office in this State including, but not limited to, a seat in the General Assembly. In addition, where Grantee is <u>not</u> an instrumentality of the State of Illinois, as described in this Paragraph, Grantee must request permission from Grantor to compensate, directly or indirectly, any person employed by an office or agency of the State of Illinois. An instrumentality of the State of Illinois includes, without limitation, State departments, agencies, boards, and State universities. An instrumentality of the State of Illinois does not include, without limitation, units of Local Government and related entities.
- 17.3. Request for Exemption. Grantee may request written approval from Grantor for an exemption from Paragraph 17.2. Grantee acknowledges that Grantor is under no obligation to provide such exemption and that Grantor may grant an such exemption subject to additional terms and conditions as Grantor may require.

ARTICLE XVIII EQUIPMENT OR PROPERTY

- 18.1. <u>Purchase of Equipment</u>. For any equipment purchased in whole or in part with Grant Funds, if Grantor determines that Grantee has not met the conditions of 2 CFR 200.439, the costs for such equipment will be disallowed. Grantor must notify Grantee in writing that the purchase of equipment is disallowed.
- 18.2. Prohibition against Disposition/Encumbrance. Any equipment, material, or real property that Grantee purchases or improves with Grant Funds must not be sold, transferred, encumbered (other than original financing) or otherwise disposed of during the Award Term without Prior Approval of Grantor unless a longer period is required in PART TWO or PART THREE and permitted by 2 CFR Part 200 Subpart D. Use or disposition of real property acquired or improved using Grant Funds must comply with the requirements of 2 CFR 200.311. Real property, equipment, and intangible property that are acquired or improved in whole or in part using Grant Funds are subject to the provisions of 2 CFR 200.316. Grantor may require the Grantee to record liens or other appropriate notices of record to indicate that personal or real property has been acquired or improved with this Award and that use and disposition conditions apply to the property.
- 18.3. Equipment and Procurement. Grantee must comply with the uniform standards set forth in 2 CFR 200.310–200.316 governing the management and disposition of property, the cost of which was supported by Grant Funds. Any waiver from such compliance must be granted by either the President's Office of Management and Budget, the Governor's Office of Management and Budget, or both, depending on the source of the Grant Funds used. Additionally, Grantee must comply with the standards set forth in 2 CFR 200.317-200.326 to establish procedures to use Grant Funds for the procurement of supplies and other expendable property, equipment, real property and other services.
- 18.4. Equipment Instructions. Grantee must obtain disposition instructions from Grantor when equipment, purchased in whole or in part with Grant Funds, is no longer needed for their original purpose. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in this Agreement, Grantor may require transfer of any equipment to Grantor or a third party for any reason, including, without limitation, if Grantor terminates the Award or Grantee no longer conducts Award activities. Grantee must properly maintain, track, use, store and insure the equipment according to applicable best practices, manufacturer's guidelines, federal and state laws or rules, and Grantor requirements stated herein.
- 18.5. <u>Domestic Preferences for Procurements</u>. In accordance with 2 CFR 200.322, as appropriate and to the extent consistent with law, Grantee must, to the greatest extent practicable under this Award, provide a preference for the purchase, acquisition, or use of goods, products, or materials produced in the United States (including but not limited to iron, aluminum, steel, cement, and other manufactured products). The requirements of this Paragraph must be included in all subawards and in all contracts and purchase orders for work or products under this Award.

ARTICLE XIX PROMOTIONAL MATERIALS; PRIOR NOTIFICATION

19.1. <u>Promotional and Written Materials</u>. Use of Grant Funds for promotions is subject to the prohibitions for advertising or public relations costs in 2 CFR 200.421(e). In the event that Grant Funds are used in whole or in part to produce any written publications, announcements, reports, flyers, brochures or other written materials, Grantee must obtain Prior Approval for the use of those funds (2 CFR 200.467) and must

include in these publications, announcements, reports, flyers, brochures and all other such material, the phrase "Funding provided in whole or in part by the [Grantor]." 2 CFR 200.467. Exceptions to this requirement must be requested, in writing, from Grantor and will be considered authorized only upon written notice thereof to Grantee.

19.2. <u>Prior Notification/Release of Information</u>. Grantee must notify Grantor ten (10) days prior to issuing public announcements or press releases concerning work performed pursuant to this Agreement, or funded in whole or in part by this Agreement, and must cooperate with Grantor in joint or coordinated releases of information.

ARTICLE XX INSURANCE

- 20.1. <u>Maintenance of Insurance</u>. Grantee must maintain in full force and effect during the Term of this Agreement casualty and bodily injury insurance, as well as insurance sufficient to cover the replacement cost of any and all real or personal property, or both, purchased or, otherwise acquired, or improved in whole or in part, with funds disbursed pursuant to this Agreement. 2 CFR 200.310. Additional insurance requirements may be detailed in <u>PART TWO</u> or <u>PART THREE</u>.
- 20.2. <u>Claims</u>. If a claim is submitted for real or personal property, or both, purchased in whole with funds from this Agreement and such claim results in the recovery of money, such money recovered must be surrendered to Grantor.

ARTICLE XXI LAWSUITS AND INDEMNIFICATION

21.1. <u>Independent Contractor</u>. Neither Grantee nor any employee or agent of Grantee acquires any employment rights with Grantor by virtue of this Agreement. Grantee must provide the agreed services and achieve the specified results free from the direction or control of Grantor as to the means and methods of performance. Grantee must provide its own equipment and supplies necessary to conduct its business; provided, however, that in the event, for its convenience or otherwise, Grantor makes any such equipment or supplies available to Grantee, Grantee's use of such equipment or supplies provided by Grantor pursuant to this Agreement is strictly limited to official Grantor or State of Illinois business and not for any other purpose, including any personal benefit or gain.

21.2. <u>Indemnification and Liability</u>.

- (a) **Non-governmental entities**. This subparagraph applies only if Grantee is a non-governmental entity. Grantee must hold harmless Grantor against any and all liability, loss, damage, cost or expenses, including attorneys' fees, arising from the intentional torts, negligence or breach of contract of Grantee, with the exception of acts performed in conformance with an explicit, written directive of Grantor. Indemnification by Grantor is governed by the State Employee Indemnification Act (5 ILCS 350/.01 et seq.) as interpreted by the Illinois Attorney General. Grantor makes no representation that Grantee, an independent contractor, will qualify or be eligible for indemnification under said Act.
- (b) **Governmental entities.** This subparagraph applies only if Grantee is a governmental unit as designated in Paragraph 3.2. Neither Party shall be liable for actions chargeable to the other Party under this Agreement including, but not limited to, the negligent acts and omissions of the other Party's

agents, employees or subcontractors in the performance of their duties as described under this Agreement, unless such liability is imposed by law. This Agreement is not construed as seeking to enlarge or diminish any obligation or duty owed by one Party against the other or against a third party.

ARTICLE XXII MISCELLANEOUS

- 22.1. <u>Gift Ban</u>. Grantee is prohibited from giving gifts to State employees pursuant to the State Officials and Employees Ethics Act (5 ILCS 430/10-10) and Illinois Executive Order 15-09.
- 22.2. <u>Assignment Prohibited</u>. This Agreement must not be sold, assigned, or transferred in any manner by Grantee, to include an assignment of Grantee's rights to receive payment hereunder, and any actual or attempted sale, assignment, or transfer by Grantee without the Prior Approval of Grantor in writing renders this Agreement null, void and of no further effect.
- 22.3. <u>Copies of Agreements upon Request</u>. Grantee must, upon request by Grantor, provide Grantor with copies of contracts or other agreements to which Grantee is a party with any other State agency.
- 22.4. <u>Amendments</u>. This Agreement may be modified or amended at any time during its Term by mutual consent of the Parties, expressed in writing and signed by the Parties.
- 22.5. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this Agreement is declared invalid, its other provisions will remain in effect.
- 22.6. <u>No Waiver</u>. The failure of either Party to assert any right or remedy pursuant to this Agreement will not be construed as a waiver of either Party's right to assert such right or remedy at a later time or constitute a course of business upon which either Party may rely for the purpose of denial of such a right or remedy.
- 22.7. <u>Applicable Law; Claims</u>. This Agreement and all subsequent amendments thereto, if any, are governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois. Any claim against Grantor arising out of this Agreement must be filed exclusively with the Illinois Court of Claims. 705 ILCS 505/1 *et seq.* Grantor does not waive sovereign immunity by entering into this Agreement.
- 22.8. <u>Compliance with Law</u>. This Agreement and Grantee's Obligations and services hereunder must be performed in compliance with all applicable federal and State laws, including, without limitation, federal regulations, State administrative rules, including but not limited to 44 III. Admin. Code Part 7000, laws and rules which govern disclosure of confidential records or other information obtained by Grantee concerning persons served under this Agreement, and any license requirements or professional certification provisions.
- 22.9. <u>Compliance with Freedom of Information Act</u>. Upon request, Grantee must make available to Grantor all documents in its possession that Grantor deems necessary to comply with requests made under the Freedom of Information Act. 5 ILCS 140/7(2).

22.10. Precedence.

(a) Except as set forth in subparagraph (b), below, the following rules of precedence are controlling for this Agreement: In the event there is a conflict between this Agreement and any of the exhibits or attachments hereto, this Agreement controls. In the event there is a conflict between PART ONE and PART TWO or PART THREE of this Agreement, PART ONE controls. In the event there is a conflict

between <u>PART TWO</u> and <u>PART THREE</u> of this Agreement, <u>PART TWO</u> controls. In the event there is a conflict between this Agreement and relevant statute(s) or rule(s), the relevant statute(s) or rule(s) controls.

- (b) Notwithstanding the provisions in subparagraph (a), above, if a relevant federal or state statute(s) or rule(s) requires an exception to this Agreement's provisions, or an exception to a requirement in this Agreement is granted by GATU, such exceptions must be noted in PART THREE, and in such cases, those requirements control.
- 22.11. <u>Illinois Grant Funds Recovery Act</u>. In the event of a conflict between the Illinois Grant Funds Recovery Act and the Grant Accountability and Transparency Act, the provisions of the Grant Accountability and Transparency Act control. 30 ILCS 708/80.
- 22.12. <u>Headings</u>. Articles and other headings contained in this Agreement are for reference purposes only and are not intended to define or limit the scope, extent or intent of this Agreement or any provision hereof.
- 22.13. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which are considered to be one and the same agreement, binding on all Parties hereto, notwithstanding that all Parties are not signatories to the same counterpart. Duplicated signatures, signatures transmitted via facsimile, or signatures contained in a Portable Document Format (PDF) document are deemed original for all purposes.
- 22.14. Attorney Fees and Costs. Unless prohibited by law, if Grantor prevails in any proceeding to enforce the terms of this Agreement, including any administrative hearing pursuant to the Grant Funds Recovery Act or the Grant Accountability and Transparency Act, Grantor has the right to recover reasonable attorneys' fees, costs and expenses associated with such proceedings.
- 22.15. Continuing Responsibilities. The termination or expiration of this Agreement does not affect: (a) the right of Grantor to disallow costs and recover funds based on a later audit or other review; (b) the obligation of the Grantee to return any funds due as a result of later refunds, corrections or other transactions, including, without limitation, final Indirect Cost Rate adjustments and those funds obligated pursuant to ARTICLE XIV; (c) the CYEFR(s); (d) audit requirements established in 44 III. Admin. Code 7000.90 and ARTICLE XII; (e) property management and disposition requirements established in 2 CFR 200.310 through 2 CFR 200.316 and ARTICLE XVIII; or (f) records related requirements pursuant to ARTICLE IX. 44 III. Admin. Code 7000.440.

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EXHIBIT A

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Project Address: North Island Park is 250 Bridge Street, Wilmington, IL 60481

Scope of Work: The Project consists of a canoe and kayak launch with an accessible, aluminum floating dock system, a gangway, an enhanced asphalt parking lot, and an accessible, concrete path from the parking lot to the launch. The Project will provide accessible river access to the Kankakee River for paddlers. The Project's two termini are the existing gravel parking lot on N Bridge Street in Wilmington, and the water to the east of the parking lot.

ARTICLE XXIII AUTHORIZED SIGNATORY

23.1. <u>Authorized Signatory</u>. The signature of the Authorized Representative for the Grantor on the signature page of this Award is considered the Authorized Signatory for purposes of this Agreement. Any amendments or changes to this Agreement must be approved and signed by the Authorized Signatory.

ARTICLE XXIV ILLINOIS WORKS JOBS ACT

24.1. <u>Illinois Works Jobs Program Act (30 ILCS 559/20-1 et seq.)</u>. For grants with an estimated total project cost of \$500,000 or more, the grantee will be required to comply with the Illinois Works Apprenticeship Initiative (30 ILCS 559/20-20 to 20-25) and all applicable administrative rules. The "estimated total project cost" is a good faith approximation of the costs of an entire project being paid for in whole or in part by appropriated capital funds to construct a public work. The goal of the Illinois Apprenticeship Initiative is that apprentices will perform either 10% of the total labor hours actually worked in each prevailing wage classification or 10% of the estimated labor hours in each prevailing wage classification, whichever is less. Code 7000.370(b), transfers between approved line items may be made without Grantor's approval only if the total amount transferred does not exceed the allowable variance of the greater of either (1) ten percent (10%) of the Budget line item, or (2) one thousand dollars (\$1,000) of the Budget line item. Discretionary line-item transfers may not result in an increase to the Budget Total. Transfers above 10% of a line item, or over \$1,000 must be requested in advance and be approved by the Grantor.

ARTICLE XXVI ADDITIONAL TERMINATION, SUSPENSION, BILLING SCHEDULE AND NON-COMPLIANCE PROVISIONS

- 26.1. <u>Remedies for Non-Compliance</u>. If Grantor suspends or terminates this Agreement pursuant to Article XIII herein, Grantor may also elect any additional remedy allowed by law, including, but not limited to, one or more of the following remedies:
 - (a) Direct the Grantee to refund Grant Funds disbursed to it under this Agreement for costs determined ineligible,

- (b) Direct the Grantee to remit an amount equivalent to the "Net Salvage Value" of all equipment or materials purchased with Grant Funds provided under this Agreement. For purposes of this Agreement, "Net Salvage Value" is defined as the amount realized, or that the Parties agree is likely to be realized from, the sale of equipment or materials purchased with Grant Funds provided under this Agreement at its current fair market value, less selling expenses; and,
- (c) Direct the Grantee to transfer ownership of equipment or materials purchased with Grant Funds provided under this Agreement to the Grantor or its designee.
- 26.2. Grant Refunds. In accordance with the Illinois Grant Funds Recovery Act, 30 ILCS 705/1 et seq., the Grantee must, within forty-five (45) days of the effective date of a termination of this Agreement, refund to Grantor, any balance of Grant Funds not spent or not obligated as of said date.

ARTICLE XXVII ADDITIONAL MODIFICATION PROVISIONS

- 27.1. <u>Unilateral Modifications</u>. The Parties agree that Grantor may, in its sole discretion, unilaterally modify this Agreement without prior approval of the Grantee when the modification is initiated by Grantor for the sole purpose of increasing the Grantee's funding allocation as additional funds become available for the Award during the program year covered by the Term of this Agreement. A unilateral modification may also be used to deobligate funds without prior approval of the Grantee when, a) a project is completed and funds remain that are no longer needed for the grant project, b) to secure unobligated/unspent funds, c) termination of the Grant Agreement.
- 27.2. <u>Term Extensions</u>. The Grantee acknowledges that all Grant Funds must be expended or legally obligated, and all Grant Activities, Deliverables, Milestones and Performance Measures (Exhibits A, B and E) must be completed during the Grant Term set forth in paragraph 2.1 herein. Extensions of the Award Term will be granted only for good cause, subject to the Grantor's discretion. Pursuant to the Grant Funds Recovery Act (30 ILCS 705/1 et seq.), no Award may be extended in total beyond a two (2)-year period unless the Grant Funds are expended or legally obligated during that initial two-year period, or unless Grant Funds are disbursed for reimbursement of costs previously incurred by the Grantee. If Grantee requires an extension of the Award Term, Grantee should submit a written request to the Grant Manager at least sixty (60) days prior to the end of the Award Term or extended Award Term, as applicable, stating the reason for the extension.

ARTICLE XXVIII ADDITIONAL EQUIPMENT OR PROPERTY PROVISIONS

- 28.1. <u>Equipment Management</u>. The Grantee is responsible for replacing or repairing equipment and materials purchased with Grant Funds that are lost, stolen, damaged, or destroyed. Any loss, damage or theft of equipment and materials shall be investigated and fully documented, and immediately reported to the Grantor and, where appropriate, the appropriate authorities.
 - 28.2. Grantee will be responsible for the maintenance of any equipment purchased with grant funds.

ARTICLE XXIX APPLICABLE STATUTES

To the extent applicable, Grantor and Grantee shall comply with the following:

- 29.1. <u>Grantee Responsibility</u>. All applicable federal, State and local laws, rules and regulations governing the performance required by Grantee shall apply to this Agreement and will be deemed to be included in this Agreement the same as though written herein in full. Grantee is responsible for ensuring compliance with all applicable laws, rules and regulations, including, but not limited to those specifically referenced herein. Except where expressly required by applicable laws and regulations.
- 29.2. <u>Land Trust/Beneficial Interest Disclosure Act (765 ILCS 405/2.1)</u>. No Grant Funds shall be paid to any trustee of a land trust, or any beneficiary or beneficiaries of a land trust, for any purpose relating to the land, which is the subject of such trust, any interest in such land, improvements to such land or use of such land unless an affidavit is first filed with the Grantor identifying each beneficiary of the land trust by name and address and defining such interest therein.
- 29.3. <u>Historic Preservation Act (20 ILCS 3420/1 et seq.)</u>. The Grantee will not expend Grant Funds under this Agreement which result in the destruction, alteration, renovation, transfer or sale, or utilization of a historic property, structure or structures, or in the introduction of visual, audible or atmospheric elements to a historic property, structure or structures, which will result in the change in the character or use of any historic property, except as approved by the Illinois Department of Natural Resources, Historic Preservation Division. The Grantee shall not expend Grant Funds under this Agreement for any project, activity, or program that can result in changes in the character or use of historic property, if any historic property is located in the area of potential effects without the approval of the Illinois Department of Natural Resources, Historic Preservation Division. 20 ILCS 3420/3(f).
- 29.4. <u>Steel Products Procurement Act (30 ILCS 565 et seq.)</u>. The Grantee, if applicable, hereby certifies that any steel products used or supplied in accordance with this Award for a public works project shall be manufactured or produced in the United States per the requirements of the Steel Products Procurement Act (30 ILCS 565 et seg).

ARTICLE XXX ADDITIONAL MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

30.1. <u>Workers' Compensation Insurance, Social Security, Retirement and Health Insurance Benefits, and Taxes</u>. The Grantee shall provide Workers' Compensation insurance where the same is required and shall accept full responsibility for the payment of unemployment insurance, premiums for Workers' Compensation, Social Security and retirement and health insurance benefits, as well as all income tax deduction and any other taxes or payroll deductions required by law for its employees who are performing services specified by this Agreement.

ARTICLE XXXI ADDITIONAL REQUIRED CERTIFICATIONS

The Grantee makes the following certifications as a condition of this Agreement. These certifications are required by State statute and are in addition to any certifications required by any Federal funding source as set forth in this

Agreement. Grantee's execution of this Agreement shall serve as its attestation that the certifications made herein are true and correct.

- 31.1. <u>Applicable Taxes</u>. The execution of this Agreement by the Grantee is its certification that (i) it is current as to the filing and payment of any federal, state and/or local taxes applicable to Grantee; and (ii) it is not delinquent in its payment of moneys owed to any federal, state, or local unit of government.
- 31.2. <u>Lien Waivers</u>. If applicable, the Grantee shall monitor construction to assure that necessary contractor's affidavits and waivers of mechanics liens are obtained prior to release of Grant Funds to contractors and subcontractors.

ARTICLE XXXII INCORPORATION

32.1. <u>Incorporation into Agreement</u>. The full Uniform Application, Unform Budget, Grant Manual, are hereby incorporated into this Agreement and therefore are a part of this Agreement.

33.2. <u>Final Project Report</u>. The Grantee shall submit a written Final Project Report to the Grantor no later than 30 days following the completion of the project or the ending date of the grant agreement, whichever is earlier, in accordance with the applicable administrative rules. The final report shall be in the form or format provided by the Grantor.

Final Project Report shall include but not be limited to the following information:

- Grant agreement number
- Grantee name, address, and telephone number
- Timeframe of the report
- Name and telephone number or e-mail address of Grantee representative completing the report
- Project objective as described in the application and grant agreement
- Completed project description
- Summary of the project accomplishments
- Any other information/documentation as required by the Grantor
- 33.3. <u>Failure to provide the Final Project Report</u>. As required may render the Grantee ineligible to receive payments under the current award or make them ineligible for future awards.

ARTICLE XXXIV EQUIPMENT REPORTS

34.1. <u>Equipment reports</u>. Are due on December 31st during each of the first 5 years following the project award. The Equipment Use Report shall suffice as the Annual Progress Report required if the equipment purchase was the only aspect of the project. (Administrative Rule 3060.80 (b) 7)

ARTICLE XXXV REIMBURSEMENT OF COSTS INCURRED

35.1. <u>Reimbursement based program</u>. Grant funds are available on a reimbursement basis for expenditures incurred by the Grantee during the grant Term as identified in this Agreement. Costs incurred prior to the effective date identified in the Term of this Agreement, and costs incurred after the expiration date for the Term of this Agreement are not eligible for reimbursement.

ARTICLE XXXVI FINANCIAL INFORMATION

- 36.1. <u>Project Costs</u>. Project costs eligible for assistance shall be determined upon the basis of criteria set forth for the Boat Access Area Development Programs as so specified in 17 Illinois Administrative Code Part 3035.
- 36.2. <u>Payment</u>. Any payment(s) to the Grantee will be made as reimbursement for eligible expenses following submission to Grantor of a certified billing request listing all funds expended and including any other documentation required by Grantor following all instructions provided in the Implementation and Billing Packet.
- 36.3. <u>Project Billings.</u> Project billings are to be submitted to the Grantor quarterly. Forms and instructions presented in the Implementation and Billing Requirements must be used.
- 26.4. <u>Final Billing.</u> A project shall be deemed completed for grant payment when the Grantee submits a final certified project billing form seeking final grant reimbursement which is approved for payment by the Grantor. Failure by the Grantee to submit required billing forms and substantiating documentation within 60 days following the project expiration date will result in the Grantee forfeiting all project reimbursements and relieves the Grantor from further payment obligations on the grant. Any grant funds remaining after final reimbursement to the Grantee will be reprogrammed at the discretion of Grantor.
- 36.5. Record Maintenance. The Grantee shall maintain, for a minimum of three years following project completion, satisfactory financial accounts, documents, and records associated with the project and the disbursement of grant funds pursuant to this Agreement, and shall make them available to the Grantor, or the Auditor General, or the Attorney General if requested, for auditing at reasonable times. Failure by the Grantee to maintain such accounts, documents, and records as required herein shall establish a presumption in favor of the State of Illinois for recovery of any funds paid by the State per this Agreement for which adequate records are not available to support their purported disbursement.
- 26.6. <u>Audit.</u> The Grantee, within 30 days of notification, shall provide the Grantor with a copy of any agency-wide audit(s) covering the period of the grant expenditures that report "findings" involving the herein referenced project.

ARTICLE XXXVII PROGRAM SPECIFIC TERMS

37.1. <u>Project Implementation</u>. Grantee is solely responsible for the design and implementation of the project described in its Project Application, the terms and conditions of which are hereby incorporated by reference and made a part of this Agreement. Failure by the Grantee to comply with any of the Agreement terms or the terms of the Project Application shall be cause for the suspension of all grant assistance obligations

thereunder and may result in debarment for two grant cycles.

- 37.2. <u>Project Progress</u>. The Grantee agrees to implement and complete the approved project pursuant to the time schedule and plans set forth in the Project Application. Failure to render satisfactory progress or to complete the approved project to the satisfaction of the Grantor per the terms of this Agreement is cause for suspension and/or termination of all obligations of the Grantor under this Agreement.
- 37.3. <u>Operation and Maintenance</u>. Grantee must comply with and abide by the following operation and maintenance provisions as well as all provisions identified in 17 Ill. Adm. Code 3035.70.
 - (a) Operation and maintenance of the grant project facility is the responsibility of the Local Agency. The boat launching and access facilities shall be continuously operated and maintained by the Local Agency at no cost to the Grantor and shall be operated and utilized in a manner that maximizes the intended benefits to and for the general public.
 - (b) All land and water areas that are open to the public shall be available for use and enjoyment by the public without regard to race or color, sex, national origin, age or disability. No lessee or licensee of an area under a concessionaire providing a service to the public, including facilities and accommodations, shall discriminate against any person or persons because of race, color, sex, national origin, age or disability in the conduct of its operation under the lease, license or concession agreement.
 - (c) No improvements, alterations or modifications of these facilities shall be permitted except with the prior approval in writing by the Grantor. Approval will be given by the Grantor if the improvements, alterations or modifications comply with the criteria in Section 3035.50.
 - (d) The Grantor shall have access to all facilities at all times to ensure management and use of the facilities are in compliance with specified program regulations.
 - (e) Boats with gasoline or diesel motors shall not be prohibited from using any facility funded through State Boating Act Funds to launch and recover unless the facility is a designated canoe launch facility as approved by the Grantor.
- 37.4. <u>Develop Projects</u>. Projects receiving development/construction grant assistance only, shall be bound by the terms of this Agreement for the period of time specified below relating to the total amount of grant funds received. (17 III. Adm. Code 3025.70)

- 37.5. <u>Acquisition Projects</u>. Land acquired with funding assistance from the BAAD program shall be operated and maintained in perpetuity for public outdoor recreation use.
- 37.6. <u>Permits/Licenses</u>. In connection with project construction, and the subsequent operation and maintenance of the facilities, the Grantee agrees that it shall be responsible for and obtain all permits, licenses, or forms of consent required to complete the project. Failure to obtain any required permit or approval may jeopardize grant reimbursement and/or cause debarment.
 - 37.7. <u>Environmental and Cultural Resource Compliance</u>. Approved grant project construction shall not

commence and no payment shall be made under this grant until the Grantee, as set forth under the Grantor's Comprehensive Environmental Review Process (CERP), has initiated and completed all necessary project review and consultation with the Grantor as required by section 11 of the Endangered Species Protection Act, 520 ILCS 10/11; section 17 of the Illinois Natural Areas Preservation Act, 525 ILCS 30/17; the mitigation or compensation determinations required by the Interagency Wetland Policy Act, 20 ILCS 830/1 et seq.; and the environmental and economic impact determination required by the Historic Preservation Act, 20 ILCS 3420/4.

- 37.8. <u>Use of Illinois Resident Labor.</u> At least 50% of the total labor hours on the project must be performed by actual residents of the State of Illinois. (20 ILCS 805/805-350).
- 37.9. <u>Public Access</u>. Any property acquired or developed through assistance from the Illinois BAAD grant program must be open to the public for outdoor recreation use without regard to race or color, creed, national origin, sex or disability, nor based on residence, except to the extent that reasonable differences in user fees may be imposed amounting to no more than double the fees charged to residents.
- 37.10. <u>Conversion</u>. Property acquired or developed with BAAD funds may not be converted to a use other than public outdoor recreation use as provided in this Part without prior Grantor approval. Approval for property conversion will be granted only if the Grantee substitutes replacement property of at least equal market value and comparable outdoor recreation usefulness, quality and location. (17 III. Adm. Code 3025.70)
- 37.11. <u>Conversion Breach</u>. Any deviation or conversion of the project site(s) from public BAAD recreation use without Grantor approval shall be considered a breach of this Agreement resulting in the Grantee being held liable for replacing said converted property with comparable land as deemed acceptable by the Grantor.
- 37.12. <u>Property Appraisal</u>. Projects receiving acquisition assistance must have an appraisal provided by the Grantee and submitted to the Grantor for review and certification to establish the property's market value. The appraisal must be completed to Grantor specifications. (17 III. Adm. Code 3035.70)
- 37.13. <u>Title/Deed</u>. For projects receiving development assistance, the Grantee must possess either fee simple title or other means of legal control and tenure (easement, lease, etc.) over the property being improved for a period of time commensurate with the program amortization schedule shown in the administrative rules, unless otherwise approved by the Grantor. The Grantor will consider, on a case-by-case basis, lease arrangements for shorter periods when State statute prohibits a unit of local government from entering into such a long-term agreement, or other circumstances beyond the control of the local unit of government prohibit such arrangements. The Grantee must also adhere to applicable local bidding and procurement requirements. (17 III. Adm. Code 3035.70)
 - 37.14. <u>Assignment.</u> No assignment of grant provisions or duties is allowed.
- 37.15. Americans with Disabilities Act. All facilities constructed with state BAAD grant assistance must be designed and developed to fully accommodate accessibility standards as per the Illinois Accessibility Code Standards, the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) (42 U.S.C. 12101 et seq.), and the regulations thereunder 28 CFR 35.130.
- 37.16. <u>Project Site Access</u>. It is agreed and understood by the Grantee that a Grantor representative shall have access to the project site to make periodic inspections as work progresses. It is further agreed and understood by the Grantee that Grantor reserves the right to inspect the completed project prior to project acceptance and grant reimbursement to the Grantee.

- 37.17. <u>Project Acknowledgement</u>. The Grantee shall give proper credit to the appropriate Fund and coordinate with the Grantor on any publication, written document, news article, television and radio release, interview or personal presentation, if initiated by the Grantee, which refers to the project.
- 37.18. <u>Signage</u>. The Grantee shall post a sign, include a logo or affix a decal, if practical and applicable, crediting the applicable Fund. Signs, logos, and decals shall be supplied by the Grantor. The IDNR will provide guidance to the Grantee for posting of signs, logos and decals on projects awarded under this Fund.
- 37.19. <u>Incorporation</u>. The OSLAD Grant Manual, the Grant Application, Grant Budget, and Implementation and Billing Packet is hereby incorporated herein by reference and made a material and binding part of this Agreement.


