## Selection Process -

The internship selection process has two parts: First, the selection committee will evaluate an initial pool of candidates who meet the minimum qualifications and conduct a brief interview to determine finalists. Second, the finalists will be referred to the appropriate city agency according to the candidate's area of interest as listed on the application. Should you be selected for the internship, you will be required to undergo a criminal background check with the city if you are 18 years of age or older.

# **Curbside Spring Clean Up**

The City's annual city-wide refuse pick up is scheduled for May 12th. This program provided by Homewood Disposal is for residents living in single-family homes or duplexes that are currently receiving City collection services.

Items to be picked up include: couches, chairs, tables, mattress, white goods (i.e. ranges, washers, dryers, appliances with Freon, water heaters), automobile tires (limit of 4 with no rims), carpet and padding (all carpet & padding must be cut into 4-foot lengths, rolled and secured with tape or sting not to exceed 50 lbs).

No pick-up for building materials, fencing, large car parts, engine oil, and yard waste.

Anyone hauling items into the City will be considered dumping and will be fined.


If you could have an unlimited supply of one thing, what would it be? *Time; there never seems to be enough.*
