# A Message from Mayor Dietz



Wilmington, I am beyond thrilled to share that Will County has awarded the city with an additional \$2 Million in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) grant funding. This grant will be for much-needed infrastructure improvements in the downtown area.

The improvements will include storm sewer rehabilitation, manhole rehabilitation, sanitary sewer lining, and water main improvements on North Kankakee Street, North Main Street, and North Water Street. In addition, North Kankakee and North Main Streets will also be repaired and repaved. Initial planning and engineering have already begun and we anticipate the work to be completed by Summer.

\$2 Million is a huge dollar amount for Wilmington, and I would like to thank Will County Executive, Jennifer Bertino-Tarrant, and Joe VanDuyne Will County Board for helping secure these funds. It is a lot of work fighting for funding and assistance and it is great working with them and having a local voice with Joe representing us on the county board.

Year to date Wilmington has received almost \$4 Million dollars in grant funding. These grants have allowed our town to take on projects that have been long overdue or on a wish list and turned them into reality.


