

The City of Wilmington Receives Route 66 Grant



The City recently received notice that we are a Heritage Corridor Destinations CVB Route 66 grant recipient in the amount of \$30,000 for a downtown wall mural/sign as well as a Route 66 monument sign (placement TBD). Our Downtown Plan identifies the Eagle Hotel and PK Guns as appropriate locations for a mural. Given the cost, size and time constraints of the project, the City has reached out to PK Guns as the most logical location for this grant.

The new sign will be installed along the Route 66 side of the building and your City Council is in the process of design approval. Project completion is anticipated in Fall '23.





Wilmington Seeks Planners To Create Comprehensive City And Master Parks Plan

The City of Wilmington is in the process of inviting consultants to submit qualifications in order to create a new document titled the Wilmington Comprehensive City and Master Parks Plan.

State law requires municipalities update their comprehensive plan every 10 years. Wilmington's current plan was completed in 2008 and we are excited for the process to begin as we update our existing Comprehensive Plan and create a new Master Park Plan within it. This document will represent the City's vision for future growth and development. The Plan will establish policies for growth management, land use, transportation and other community development-related issues and will build off of the City's existing Comprehensive Plan and other planning documents such as the Downtown Plan (available at https://www.wilmingtonil.com). Wilmington businessness and residents are invited to participate in the process.

The goal is to address areas with a high volume of speeders, in order to keep the roads safer and lower the number of accidents during this busy time of year.




Motorists are being asked to be mindful of workers and prepare for temporary lane closures on City streets.







